

St Aulaye Cricket AGM 2011: minutes

Minutes of SAC AGM held at Salle des Associations, 24410 St Aulaye, on Tuesday 14 December 2010 at 18h

1. Present: Stephen Harrison (in the chair), Wynford Hicks (minutes), Keith Randell, Peter Birch, Adrian Raynor, Charlie Nott, Daniel Nott, Jerry Mawdsley, Oliver Mawdsley. Apologies: Clive Rosen, Clive Greenwood, Barry Wedgwood.
2. Minutes of the last AGM (13 March 2010) were agreed. Matters arising: the meeting was reminded that the annual junior membership fee was now 20€ (including licence).
3. SH reported as president.
4. SH reported as treasurer; the accounts for 2010 were approved.
5. The provisional budget for 2011 was agreed.
6. Authority to sign cheques on the club's behalf (president and secretary) was agreed.
7. Agreed that the president would represent the club at meetings of France Cricket, FFBS and regional bodies.
8. Membership and licence fees: the annual membership fee for individual adults (covering other family members) would continue to be 30€, with a senior player's licence 30€ for those paying their subs before 15 March and 35€ for those paying after 15 March; the junior membership fee was now 20€ (including licence); home match fees were 10€ for seniors and 5€ for juniors.
9. The bureau was elected as follows: KR (president), Charlie Nott (vice-president and treasurer), WH (secretary), AR (club captain), SH.
10. AOB: Daniel Nott agreed to write regular match reports.

Addendum 2: membership, licences and match fees

A. Membership. There are three categories:

1. Life members, who pay a one-off fee (currently 225€/£150); there are 10 life members and two honorary life members (Pat & Dot Barry).
2. Senior members, who pay an annual fee, which covers partners and other family members up to the age of 21.
3. Junior members covered by 2. above and also those under 21 not covered by 2. who hold a junior player's licence; membership is automatic without payment of a further fee.

B. Licences. A player's licence is essential for anyone intending to take part in organised, competitive cricket as player or umpire. (The stipulation that scorers must be licensed does not apply in the SW.) The player – or parent in the case of a junior – is liable for the full cost of a player's licence.

C. Match fees. Match fees are payable at all home matches; at away matches players, including juniors, who travel in other members' cars are asked to pay the driver the equivalent of a home match fee.

Addendum 3: St Aulaye Casuals

There are no restrictions on who can be asked to play for the Casuals. Match fees are payable (as for SAC home matches above) and regular players are encouraged to become members of St Aulaye Cricket.
